2nd. Set down in the inventory all money belonging to deceased; if there be none, state that fact.

3rd. Give a full description of all real estate and the improvements thereon, and set down the value thereof in dollars and cents in figures in the right-hand column opposite.

4th. All other personal property, setting down each article separately, with the value thereof in dollars and cents in figures opposite to the articles respectively, including all debts, partnerships and other interests, bonds, mortgages, notes and other securities for the payment of money belonging to the deceased, specifying the name of the debtor in each security, the date, the sum originally payable, the endorsements thereon (if any), with their dates, and the sum which, in the judgment of the appraisers, may be collected on each debt, interest or security.

5th. Appraise the property at its actual value as near as you can, as you are sworn to do so, as the Court depends on the appraisalment to know the value.

6th. Make diligent inquiry and find out all the property belonging to the estate, and state, as far as the same can be ascertained, what portion of the property is community property, and what portion is the separate property of the deceased.
